Google Chrome should be the default browser on your devices. The version of Safari on your MacBook may not be compatible with virtual.class.com therefore it should not be used for ilearn, your email, or class.com to prevent confusion.

It will guide you through making Chrome the default browser, adjusting Chrome privacy settings, and downloading Chrome if it is not already on your device.

In partnership with the U.S. Forest Service, <u>MobilizeGreen</u> is offering a Virtual Youth Conservation Crew (YCC) Intern Program in the Summer of 2024.

The Virtual Youth Conservation Crew is a three-week program where participants blend virtual learning sessions with logistics, planning, and project management skills.

Participants' daily schedules will blend virtual lessons and curriculum, with exploring Green STEM career opportunities and designated time for project planning. You must be 15 years of age by June 1st. This is a paid opportunity.

School Schedule

Students must be signed in and ready for class by 9 a.m. sharp. The school day for all students starts at 9 a.m. and ends at 3:15 p.m.

Attendance / Parent Notification of Absence

The city requires young people between ages 6 and 17 to attend school full-time. Students are expected to maintain 90% attendance or better (less than one day per month). Students with less than 90% attendance are more likely to struggle in their classes, especially in virtual learning environments.

Daily attendance is taken in Advisory Period 1. Students who arrive at any class after 15 minutes late will receive an outreach stating they are absent. For absences (medical or otherwise) OR if you believe your child has been marked absent in error, the *parent along with the student* should contact: Your Child's Advisor AND

Parents will also receive automatic text notifications at 11 a.m. if a student has been marked absent from their first and second-period classes. School staff will contact the parents of students marked absent from advisory. Counselor Conferences will be held for those who have developed a pattern of absences from school or a particular class(es).

Lateness

If you are late due to Wi-Fi or device issues, please email the class teacher a screenshot showing your attempt to get into the class, and include Ms. Lee, clee 2801@schools.nyc.gov for Tech Support; they will reverse your attendance once confirmed, and help troubleshoot your tech issues.

Mondays

Mondays are designed for independent work. Students have Community Circle, Socratic Seminar, and Study Hall for live or synchronous instruction and Science lab and independent reading asynchronously.

Device Distribution

If your child needs a device, we provide a MacBook Air or a Chromebook. Please get in touch with the Parent Coordinator to schedule a pick-up. We can set up a pick-up at one of our locations, depending on which is most convenient for you to pick up.

We also have student planners, noise-cancelling headphones, art supplies, and independent reading books and a VIA tote bag available for pickup ONLY.

HotSpots, ID Cards, and MetroCards

We currently have a limited supply of hotspots that are being disbursed on an emergency need basis.

Student IDs and MetroCards have been mailed. If you are in need of a MetroCard, and would like one mailed to you, please confirm your mailing addresses using this <u>survey</u>. All 9th and 10th Graders will be receiving new IDs. 10th graders if you do not submit a new photo, your photo from last year will be used.


Study Hall is built in tutoring during the day. Study hall is a productive space where students can drop in to study, work on homework assignments, or collaborate with peers on group projects.

Remote Learning Devices



Students in need of remote learning can be issued a device for their educational use. If reasonable precautions and care are taken in the use of the device, the laptop should not experience physical damage. Each parent/guardian should review this information carefully with their child.

All devices issued to students are to be used to access remote learning and other educational uses. Students are expected to follow the guidelines below and take any additional common sense precautions to protect the device. Students are responsible for taking care of the device. The policies outlined in the device loan agreement are intended to cover all available technologies, not just those specifically listed.

By accepting any equipment Parents/Guardians and Caregivers agreed to ensure that your child adheres to the following:

Return of Device:

This device is being loaned for the student's use during remote learning. This device is the property of the NYCDOE and contains a tracking device so that the device can be located. This device must be returned when student graduates or is unenrolling from VIA, unless otherwise instructed by VIA/NYCDOE.

Care and Maintenance:

- The student/family is responsible for the daily care and maintenance of the laptop. Any damage or theft must be reported to the school within one school day.
- · Keep the laptop in a safe place when not in use.
- Students/families should report problems to the school immediately. Do not attempt to remove, add, or change the physical structure of the device, including keys, memory, battery, screen, charger, ID labels, etc.
- Carry the device carefully at all times. Do not store items on top of the device.
- Do not stick labels or decorative stickers on the device.

A device may be returned or replaced due to "REASONABLE" wear and tear or unexpected malfunctions. Screen cracks are not covered under warranty and must be paid for by the Parents/Guardians/Caregivers of the student. MacBooks that have been damaged due to poor maintenance will be replaced with Chromebooks only.

Usage Guidelines:

In general, all students are expected to use good judgment and common sense; be safe, appropriate, careful and kind online; not attempt to get around technological protection measures; and ask an adult if they need help.

Student Acceptable Use Guidelines:

Students must:

- · Use the device provided only to access remote learning activities.
- Follow the same guidelines for respectful, responsible behavior online that students are expected to follow offline.
- Treat this device carefully, and alert the helpdesk there is any problem with the operation.
- Understand that this equipment is property of the New York City Department of Education and should be treated as such. If equipment is stolen, a police report must be filed.
- · Alert a teacher or other staff member if students see threatening, inappropriate, or harmful content (images, messages, posts) online.
- Be cautious to protect the safety of the student and others.
- · Help to protect the security of school resources.

Students must not:

- Attempt to bypass the school's mobile (internet) filter.
- Use this device in a way that could be personally or physically harmful.
- Attempt to find inappropriate images or content.
- Engage in cyberbullying, harassment, or disrespectful conduct toward others. Such conduct will result in disciplinary action and loss of privileges. In some cases, cyberbullying can be a crime.
- Try to find ways to circumvent the school's safety measures and filtering tools.
- Use school technologies to send spam or chain mail.
- Use language online that would be unacceptable in the classroom.
- Use school technologies for illegal activities or to pursue information on such activities.
- Attempt to hack or access sites, servers, or content that isn't intended for student use.
- Alter a school's device hardware or installed software.

Personal Safety and Privacy:

- Users should never share personal information, including phone number, address, social security number, birthday, or financial information, over the Internet without adult permission.
- Users should recognize that communicating over the Internet brings anonymity and associated risks, and should carefully safeguard the personal information of themselves and others.
- Users should never agree to meet someone they meet online in real life without parental permission. If students see a message, comment, image, or anything else online that makes them concerned for their personal safety, they should bring it to the attention of an adult immediately.

<u>Limitation of Liability</u>

The NYCDOE will not be responsible for damage or harm to persons, files, data, or hardware. Devices employ filtering and other safety and security mechanisms, but there is no guarantee as to their effectiveness. The NYCDOE will not be responsible, financially or otherwise, for unauthorized transactions conducted over the school network.

Cameras ON Policy



Effective Dec 1st, 2023

After meeting with the SLT and Parent Association members on November 30th and gaining their support, we have decided to move towards a cameras-on policy for the first and last five minutes of each class.

We know that we do not have compliance for our cameras on policy and we want to work to gain at least 80% compliance in each class before the December holiday vacation.

To that end, an email was sent to all students and families on Friday, December 1st introducing the policy and explaining that due to attendance verification procedures we will require cameras on with no avatars or passes for the first and last five minutes of every class. The goal is to visually check in and out with students in every class so that we can verify attendance.

Our circle keepers will then lead community building activities for the remainder of Community Circle on Mondays. All Advisors have been asked to review and enforce this change in advisory every day until the December vacation.

I ask that each teacher insist on compliance at the beginning and end of each class starting on Monday. Please use a classroom expectations rubric to reward students who adhere to the policy and to consequate students who do not adhere to the policy.

Parents we kindly seek you support us in enforcing this policy which ensures community safety and encourages engagement and inclusivity. If we act as a unified team and each do our part to reinforce this policy in every meet, we will gain compliance over time.
